

## Rehabilitation of the Thamesford Water Tower

202 Stanley Street N, Thamesford, Township of Zorra

In 2019, Oxford County awarded a contract to Landmark Structures Co/Landmark Municipal Services ULC to rehabilitate the existing water tower in Thamesford. Works completed in 2019 generally included recoating of the interior steel water tank/reservoir, cleaning of the concrete pedestal, and miscellaneous safety upgrades. The contractor will now be returning to the site to complete the exterior painting/coating of the steel tank and final restorations.

Construction is expected to begin June 1, 2020

### PROJECT COMPLETION

The remaining works are expected to be substantially completed by June 30, 2020.

### WORKING HOURS AND NOISE

It's anticipated that working hours will typically be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday to Friday and Saturdays; however, the contractor may work additional hours as required to meet project milestones/completion dates.

The contractor has advised that generators will be loud, particularly those used for the application of new coatings.

### TRAFFIC CONTROL

No road closures are scheduled for this project since all proposed work is located on the tower site at 202 Stanley Street; however, local residents should be cautious of trucks and other vehicles entering/exiting the site, etc.

### WATER SERVICE AND USAGE

Although the tower will be temporarily out of service for a period of approximately one month, water service to existing residents will be maintained. Pressures may be affected during times of peak demand. Residents are requested to conserve water usage whenever possible.

### FIRE PROTECTION

The local fire department has been notified that water storage will be out of service, and will make alternate arrangements to ensure continued fire protection services throughout the project.

### COVID-19

Given the developing situation around COVID-19 the County and all contractors/sub-contractors working on behalf of the County are committed to following the recommended precautionary measures, within other safety imperatives, to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Oxford County is continually monitoring this situation as it develops and the ongoing challenges related to the spread of COVID-19.

The work being undertaken on this project has been deemed essential to County infrastructure and is considered essential as per the provincial directives and mandates.

An Oxford County representative will be on-site periodically, performing inspection of the contractor's work and monitoring site activities.
