

Oxford County has a long-standing commitment to zero waste. This means the County is committed to reducing waste generation and disposal; maximizing resource recovery, for instance, through recycling; and promoting the Circular Economy through the Zero Waste Plan.

During Circular Economy Month and Waste Reduction Week, Oxford County is helping to spread awareness about the benefits of the circular economy. Instead of looking at the materials we produce in a linear path—make, take, waste—a circular economy considers a more sustainable, closed-loop system where resources are kept in circulation for as long as possible through re-use and new uses.
