Oxford Road 2 (Dundas Street) Thamesford corridor improvements

Construction begins this fall between 15th Line and Oxford Road 119

About this project

Oxford County will begin work on transportation improvements along Oxford Road 2 (Dundas Street) in Thamesford in the Township of Zorra this month to accommodate increasing traffic volumes, support continued growth in Thamesford, and improve safety for all road users. The contract for this work has been awarded to KWS Electrical Services.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin the week of September 28, 2026, and is expected to continue through November 2026. Please note that construction schedules are weather dependent and subject to change based on site conditions, contractor availability and other operational demands.

Construction

During construction, Oxford Road 2 (Dundas Street) is expected to remain open to traffic throughout construction, with two-way traffic maintained whenever practical.

Temporary lane reductions, lane shifts, or short-duration alternating traffic controlled by traffic-control personnel may be required to complete certain portions of the work.

Access to residences and businesses will be maintained as much as possible, with advance notice provided for any planned temporary access disruptions.

Work on the Thamesford downtown corridor includes the following:

- new traffic signals installed at George Street;
- speed feedback signs installed near the east and west limits of Thamesford;
- existing pedestrian crossover relocated from George Street to Stanley Street;
- two-way left-turn lane installed between Stanley Street and Allen Street;
- on-street parking removed along the project corridor;
- upgrades to the existing traffic signals at Allen Street / St. Patrick Street;
- localized curb, sidewalk, boulevard, pavement-marking, and signage improvements;

- construction of concrete medians and pedestrian accessibility improvements at key locations; and,
- targeted streetlighting improvements associated with the Stanley Street pedestrian crossover and the George Street and Allen Street / St. Patrick Street traffic signals.

Construction impacts

Residents, businesses and road users should expect the following:

- temporary lane reductions, lane shifts and flagging operations, particularly near Stanley Street, George Street and Allen Street / St. Patrick Street;
- short-term driveway or property access interruptions. Access will be maintained as much as possible, and advance notice will be provided for planned disruptions;
- removal of on-street parking along Dundas Street within the project limits;
- increased noise, dust and construction traffic;
- short-term detours or pedestrian routing where required to complete work safely.

Waste and recycling collection is not currently expected to be affected. If temporary changes are required, affected residents and businesses will be notified in advance.

Please help keep our community and workers

safe: respect work zones, obey traffic signs and directions from traffic-control personnel, and maintain a safe distance from equipment and vehicles entering or leaving the site.
