Upcoming road closures

Oxford Road 9 (Hamilton Road/King Street West) infrastructure improvements

About this project

Oxford County has awarded a contract to J-AAR Civil Infrastructure Ltd. for infrastructure improvements on Oxford Road 9 (Hamilton Road/King Street West), from CPKC Railway west to the Town of Ingersoll boundary and the intersection of Oxford Roads 9 and 10 (Ingersoll Street South).

This work will include relocating utilities; installing sanitary sewer, watermain, curb and gutter; new traffic signals at Oxford Roads 9 and 10 and new street lighting; storm sewer improvements; sidewalk upgrades; and landscaping and restoration.

Construction will be carried out in two phases:

- **Phase 1 (November 2025 – March 2026):** Sanitary sewer work via micro tunneling (minimal impact to traffic)
- **Phase 2 (March – December 2026):** Sanitary sewer, watermain and storm sewer, full road reconstruction, traffic signals, and final surface (asphalt) treatments

Construction impacts

Traffic control

During Phase 2 of construction, which is expected to begin as early as March 16, 2026, Oxford Road 9 will be closed to through traffic. Traffic will be limited to local residents, businesses and emergency services. The contractor will be required to maintain access as best as possible to all properties. Some short-term interruptions and delays can be expected.

Emergency services and school buses will be notified of all road closures and lane restrictions. There will be a planned detour route in place and detour signage posted for the duration of the road closure.

Detour: Oxford Road 10 (Ingersoll Street North), Road 60, Elgin Road and Hamilton Road

Please note that additional local detour routes may be in place at set periods during construction.

Safety

Please help keep our community and workers safe: respect work zones, obey traffic signs, and maintain a safe distance from equipment and vehicles entering and leaving the site.

Garbage and recycling

If access for waste collection is interrupted by construction, the contractor will collect homeowner bins and containers and take them to a central location for collection. Property owners are asked to mark garbage, recycling and organics containers with their house number so they can be returned to the correct property. Please continue to have your regular household waste and recyclables on the roadside by 7:00 a.m. on your regular pick-up day.

Water interruptions

Residents within the work area can expect both planned and unplanned water interruptions. Every attempt will be made to notify residents in advance.

Private sprinkler systems, landscaping or fencing

Please remove all items on Oxford County property in advance of construction. The County is not responsible for damage to private landscaping items located on County property.

Lawn restoration

Following construction, the contractor will place new sod on affected properties and water it as needed for 30 days after placement. After the 30 days, the sod maintenance and watering is the responsibility of the property owner, as it was prior to construction.
